While receiving countless honors in football, basketball, and track at Manitou Springs High School, Armour graduated as valedictorian with a 4.0 grade point average. He earned a football scholarship at Stanford University, where he played football for four years and basketball for two. In 1995, he was the Buffalo Bills' fourth-round draft pick and played an outstanding rookie season, starting nearly every game. At the end of the season, he suffered a devastating injury to his foot and spent his second season with the Bills on Injured Reserve.

Still not at full strength his third season, Armour was cut and eventually picked up by the Denver Broncos, where he played for one memorable season: it was John Elway's final year – the year the Bronco's won their second consecutive Super Bowl.

Armour's fifth and final season was his personal best. Proving what he is capable of, he made four touchdowns and 37 receptions with the Baltimore Ravens.

Armour lives in Baja, Mexico, where he and his wife, Cara, built an athletic park for the community. They have two children, Joah and Avah.
