



**ALAN COCKRELL:** One of the best players in Colorado Springs professional baseball history. The Joplin, Missouri, native played for the Sky Sox in 1990, 1992, 1994 and 1996, and became the all-time team leader in games played (494), hits (478), doubles (91), RBI (286) and walks (183). In 1990, he was a Pacific Coast League All-Star after hitting .330 with 17 home runs and 70 RBI, and was a member of the 1992 Sky Sox PCL Championship team when it was a Cleveland Indian farm club. He ended with a career batting average of .304 and was named to the Sky Sox Hall of Fame. In all, he played 13 seasons as a minor league outfielder, and made his major league debut in 1996 and got his first hit against Atlanta's Tom Glavine. The former University of Tennessee football quarterback, baseball All-American, and San Francisco Giants first-round pick became the hitting coach for the Colorado Rockies in 2007 after coaching stints in Portland, Salem, and Colorado Springs.
