

Fisher DeBerry

The winningest coach in Air Force Academy history, Fisher DeBerry has become as much a part of the AFA landscape as Falcon Stadium. Now in his 22nd season as the head football coach, he stands second in career wins in Mountain West Conference history, and he is seventh among all active coaches.

DeBerry has received numerous accolades across the nation, including being named National Coach of the Year, State Farm Coach of Distinction and he was also inducted into the South Carolina and Wofford Sports Halls of Fame.

A 1960 graduate of Wofford College, DeBerry lettered in football and baseball and he eventually coached there for two years. In 1980, DeBerry joined the Air Force Academy as the quarterbacks coach. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1981, then became the Academy's fifth head coach in 1983.

In addition to his contributions to sports at the Air Force Academy, DeBerry is active in church, charity and community, including his strong ties to the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and his launching of a foundation dedicated to providing children of single-parent families with support for sports and other opportunities.

DeBerry and his wife, LuAnn, have two children and five grandchildren.
