



F. DON MILLER AWARD RECIPIENT GREGG STINSON

Gregg Stinson has devoted much of his life to coaching young people in track and field and physical education and being a positive influence in their lives. He is a Physical Education teacher at Abrams Elementary School at Fort Carson, a prep track & field coach at Fountain-Fort Carson High School and a USA Track & Field coach for the Joe Gentry Track Troupe.

Stinson has worked steadily and quietly with youth in sports for over three decades, giving thousands of hours of his own time to the development of kids in track & field and wholesome sport.

He currently holds an open gym program before school for children of deployed Fort Carson soldiers who need before-school care and additional support while one parent serves in Iraq. He has been a coach, official, teacher, trainer and mentor to hundreds of kids in the Pikes Peak region without significant recognition.

The Col. F Don Miller Award is presented annually to an area individual dedicated to the importance of sports in building young lives.

The award is a fitting tribute to the late Colonel Miller, the Executive Director of the United States Olympic Committee from 1969-85 and the thousands of young men and women who pursued their Olympic dreams with his assistance and support.
