



RACHAEL FLATT

Olympian & U.S. Figure Skating National Champion

Inducted October 25, 2016

Colorado Springs skating legend Rachael Flatt became the U.S. Figure Skating National Champion and an Olympian in 2010, finishing 7th in the ladies program in the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver. During her career, Flatt was also a 2008 World Junior Champion, three-time U.S. National Silver Medalist, and three-time World Team member with a best finish of 5th place.



Vancouver Olympic Games, Flatt graduated Summa Cum Laude from Cheyenne Mountain High School's AP/Honors Program and went on to pursue her education at Stanford University, graduating in 2015 after earning a B.S. in biology and a minor in psychology. While at Stanford, she received the Order of Omega Outstanding Athleticism Award and the school's Award of Excellence.

Her career highlights include being a four-time Senior Grand Prix Silver Medalist, two-time Junior Grand Prix Medalist (gold and silver), 2007 Junior Grand Prix Silver Medalist, 2006 U.S. Junior Silver Medalist, and 2005 U.S. Novice National Champion. After competing in the 2010

Flatt remains engaged in figure skating and served as a representative of the U.S. Department of State's Sports Envoy in its "Sports United" program and visited St. Petersburg, Russia, in conjunction with the 2014 Olympic Winter Games in Sochi.
