



Scott Johnson

A 1979 graduate of Colorado Springs' Wasson High School, Scott Johnson was one of the most dominant gymnasts of his era. Johnson was a member of the gold medal-winning U.S. Men's Gymnastics Team at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Four years later, he served as team captain for the United States at the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, Korea.

Johnson was a three-time U.S. National Champion and won the all-around title in 1987. That same year, he was the Pan American Games all-around champion and became the first gymnast in the history of that competition to win medals in every event (four gold, four silver). He represented the United States in four World Championships.

Born in Cincinnati, Ohio, Johnson didn't take up the sport of gymnastics until his family moved to Colorado Springs when he was 10 years old. He won the 1979 Colorado High School State Championship before moving on to the University of Nebraska, where he was a seven-time NCAA Champion and NCAA All-American while competing for the Cornhuskers from 1979-83.

Johnson and his wife, Lori, now reside in the Orlando, Fla., suburb of Oviedo, where they are raising their two sons, Nicholas (11) and Nathan (10).
