



CHEYENNE MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS TENNIS TEAMS 1986-2012

*17-Time State Champions
Inducted October 30, 2012*

The girls tennis teams at Cheyenne Mountain High School have established a true dynasty that is among the most significant in state history.

The teams have won 17 state prep championships in the years 1986-88, 1991-98, 2000, 2007, and four straight Class 4A titles from 2009-2012.

The 1986 team ended powerful Cherry Creek's long string of titles, led by singles star Joanne Varnum, who went on to play at the University of Arkansas.



Her sister, Becky, became the first state tennis player to win four straight singles titles (1994, 1995, 1996, 1997) in the #1 spot and never lost a match, finishing at 68-0 for the team. She went on to play at Notre Dame, where she chalked up a 92-66 mark in singles play and 105-52 in doubles, becoming an All-American. She was inducted into the Colorado Tennis Hall of Fame in 2009.

The championship winning coaches who have sustained the incredible string of success are Dave Adams, Martha Bartz, Jackie Jones, and Bob Scott.
