



## PAT GARRITY

*All-American Basketball Player*

*Inducted October 24, 2017*

A three-time All-State selection and 1994 Class 4A Player of the Year, Pat Garrity led Lewis Palmer High School to the 1994 Colorado Class 4A Basketball Championship. He graduated as valedictorian in 1994 and his jersey number 53 is retired at Lewis-Palmer.

At Notre Dame, Garrity led the team in scoring for four consecutive seasons and started all 111 games he played. He earned Big East Men's Basketball Player of the Year in 1997, Big East Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Consensus Second Team All-America honors in 1998 and Academic All-American of the Year for Men's Division I basketball in 1998.



Upon completion of his college career, Notre Dame honored Garrity with the Byron V. Kanaley Award, the school's most prestigious award for graduating student athletes.

Drafted 19th overall in the first round of the 1998 NBA Draft by the Milwaukee Bucks, Garrity was traded on draft night to the Phoenix Suns where he played his rookie season. He played nine years with the

Orlando Magic before retiring in 2008. Following his NBA career, he earned an MBA from Duke University's Fuqua School of Business. He, along with wife Paula and son Henry, currently resides in Birmingham, MI and serves as the Associate General Manager of the Detroit Pistons.
