



1995 DOHERTY HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS BASKETBALL TEAM

RANKED #3 IN THE NATION

This team may be the best squad in Colorado high school girls basketball history. Coach Carl Krug's powerful squad went 25-0 and defeated Heritage, 39-32, for the state 5A title. Doherty was among USA Today's national top five during the entire season and finished third.

Point guard Stephanie Frisch was a first team All-Colorado selection and went on to play at the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs after transferring from New Mexico State University. At UCCS, she became the all-time scorer for the Mountain Lions at the time and was the first in school history to earn All-RMAC honors in women's basketball.

Dena Koskovich became a star at Regis University in Denver where she led her team in three-point field goals for three seasons and twice for rebounds. Nikki Swagger ultimately played at the University of Colorado and Arizona State. Jacque Johnson played at Colorado State University and was with a Rams team that made it into the NCAA Elite Eight in her junior year. Chelsea Richardson played for the University of San Francisco. Mandy Gonser played for the University of Wyoming. Cami Burns went on to play at Otero Junior College. Karen Rants went on to play for the University of Colorado-Colorado Springs from 1996-1999 where she scored 941 points and led the team in rebounds in 1997 with 149 grabs.
