



SCOTT OWENS

Colorado College Ice Hockey Head Coach

Inducted November 1, 2021

Scott Owens was the longest tenured and winningest head coach in the illustrious history of Colorado College men's hockey with 324 wins (.579) in 15 seasons. Owens became CC's head coach in 1999 and one of the nation's best recruiters, recording 16 All-American selections and two Hobey Baker Memorial Award winners-Peter Sejna (2003) and Marty Sertich (2005).



The Tigers averaged 22 wins per season, including a historic 31 victories in 2004-05, won three WCHA regular season championships, reached seven NCAA tournaments and made it to the 2005 NCAA Frozen Four under Owens' direction. The Tigers also held a 35-24-9 record against its arch-rival - University of Denver, one of the most intense rivalries in NCAA Division I Hockey.

After leaving CC in 2014, Owens became the head coach and general manager of the Sioux Falls Stampede in the USHL. Over his five seasons there, he obtained 144 wins (.561) including a 39-16-7 record during the 2018-19 season and an 11-1 post-season record culminating in the team's third Clark Cup Championship.

Retiring in 2020, he finished his career with a 729-454-116 (.606) record and set many regular season records between the Madison Capitols, Des Moines Buccaneers, CC Tigers and Sioux Falls Stampede. He ranks eighth in USHL wins with 405 and has 52 career post-season wins and two Clark Cup Championships.
